





RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKING

Recreational vehicles are to park in one of three places: the parking lot of the Phillips Theme Tower, the Upper parking lot which is located off Seaver Drive just before you get to President's Drive, and the dirt lot which is located above the Seaver Dorms and just below the Law School. There are no hookups available. Please remember to get your temporary parking pass at the guard gate.

MEALS

CAFETERIA: The Pepperdine cafeteria will be open during the lectureship. In order to keep the lines moving, please purchase your meal tickets in advance at Lectureship Central or before and after the lectures in Firestone Fieldhouse. Times and prices of meals are listed below:

- 2. Please register your children at the Child Care registration desk at Appleby Center. You will sign your children in and out each time you use our Child Care Program.
- Well children are welcome! PLEASE—NO fevers or bad colds!
- 4. Play clothes should be worn at all times as we are planning many outdoor activities. In the afternoon of Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, a trip to the swimming pool is planned for ages 5 and up. Please send a swimming suit and a towel with your child for this activity. Lifeguards will be on duty at all times.
- Wholesome snacks will be provided.
 Please do not send sugar snacks, candy
 or gum with your children. Please notify
 the registration person of any food
 allergies.
- 6. Label all items to be left in Child Care including toys, blankets, and extra clothes. Please take special care in labeling baby items (blankets, bottles, diapers, etc).
- 7. A nap area will be available. Please note on your registration form the preferred nap hour.

TRANSPORTATION

Buses and vans will be traveling every 10 to 15 minutes before and after classes and the main lectures. PARKING INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

No parking is allowed in the main parking lot Tuesday through Friday, 8:00 a.m.-5 p.m. The security personnel will activate the gate to allow entrance for loading and unloading after which time you will be required to remove your vehicle. You may park your car anywhere along Seaver Drive, Grand Boulevard or Firestone Fieldhouse parking lot.

No parking is allowed in fire lanes by dormitories, only a reasonable time for loading and unloading (this regulation is made and imposed by the Fire Marshall).
