#### DAVID DAVENPORT

Malibu, California

"The Finality of Christ" (Hebrews 1:1-4)

On Tuesday, April 16, 1985, David Davenport will assume office as the sixth president of Pepperdine University. On the evening of this historic occasion, he will give the opening address for the University's 42nd Annual Bible Lectureship.

A native of Kansas, Davenport has served the University for five years, first as associate professor, then as general counsel, and for the past two years as executive vice president. Following in the footsteps of the five presidents before him, Davenport, 34, is a preacher of the gospel. While at Pepperdine, he has preached on a part-time basis for several congregations in the Los Angeles area, including Inglewood, Culver Palms, and the University Church.

Before coming to Pepperdine, Davenport had a law practice in San Diego, at one time taking a year's leave of absence to preach full-time for the El Cajon Boulevard Church of Christ. He also served as co-host of the popular "Know Your Bible" television program, with a weekly viewing audience of forty thousand people.

Davenport was raised in Overland Park, a suburb of Kansas City, and was a member of the Overland Park Church of Christ. He later served there as associate minister. He earned his bachelor of arts in international relations from Stanford University and received his juris doctorate degree from the University of Kansas.

## FEATURED CLASS, SMOTHERS THEATRE DAILY AT 9:45 A.M. "How to Grow a Church"



DICK MARCEAR, Amarillo, Texas

Dick Marcear is nearing the completion of a doctorate in church growth from Fuller Theological Seminary. For the past nine years, he has served as the pulpit minister for the Central Church of Christ in Amarillo, Texas. During that time, the attendance at the Sunday morning worship has grown from eight hundred to more than two thousand. The weekly contribution has increased from \$5,400 to \$23,700, while the Sunday morning Bible School has grown from a weekly average of 630 students to an average of 1,422 students.

The Central Church of Christ has grown steadily for nine consecutive years, in spite of the fact that the church building is located in downtown Amarillo, and not in the more rapidly developing suburbs. In addition to a number of other factors, Marcear is convinced that women have had a strong impact on the growth of the Central Church. During his three classes at the Pepperdine Lectures, Marcear will give special attention to the role of women in the growth of a local church.

#### HOUSING INFORMATION

Since Pepperdine's Bible Lectureship occurs during the spring break, dormitory space will be available to our lectureship guests. If you wish to reserve space, please include \$12.50 per bed with your registration form when you send it in. This charge covers the entire week (Tuesday through Friday nights). Due to the great demand for on-campus housing, dorm beds are reserved for adults only. Children may be housed free of charge, provided they bring sleeping bags and sleep on the floor.

Regardless of how many nights you will be staying, the fee remains the same. However, if you are planning on coming to the lectureship for only a day or two, we strongly suggest that you provide for your own sleeping accommodations by staying with a friend in the Los Angeles/Malibu area, or by making a motel reservation by calling one of the motels listed on the back page of the insert. Due to the limited number of beds on our campus, we must give preference to those who are staying the entire week (Tuesday through Friday nights).

Please bring your own bedding. Linens are available (\$10.00 per set) only to those who are either arriving by plane or are from out of state and make arrangements in advance. Dorms are open from 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April16, through 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 20. Please do not plan to check into your dorm room before 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday the 16th. We will not have available staff to assist you until noon. When you arrive on campus, please go directly to your pre-assigned dorm where you will obtain a packet of materials and your dorm room key. 

Howard A. White is completing his 27th year of service to Pepperdine University. He first came to Pepperdine in 1958 as a professor of history and chairman of the department of social sciences. Three years later, he was named director of Pepperdine's graduate program and in 1965 became dean of graduate studies. He subsequently served as dean of undergraduate studies before being appointed executive vice president, a post in which he served from 1970 to 1978, when he was elected unanimously by the Board of Regents as the fifth president of Pepperdine University.

A native of Alabama, Dr. White received his bachelor's, master's and Ph.D. degrees in history at Tulane University, where he won the Montgomery Prize in history. From 1953 to 1958, he taught at David Lipscomb College, and served as head of the history department. In 1983, Dr. White received the LL.D. from Lubbock Christian College. He was honored as alumnus of the year by David Lipscomb College in 1984.

He has served as minister for Churches of Christ in Columbus, Jackson, and Charleston, Mississippi; for the Carrollton Avenue Church of Christ in New Orleans where he served for 12 years; for the Green Hill and Acklen Avenue congregations in Nashville, Tennessee; and for the Westchester and Maywood congregations in Los Angeles, California. He also conducted a weekly radio program of gospel preaching for more than 10 years in New Orleans. He is a member of the staff of 20th Century Christian, and has spoken at lectureships at David Lipscomb College, Harding University and Abilene Christian University as well as at Pepperdine. Currently, he is an elder of the University Church in Malibu, California.

Housing check-in will begin promptly at 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 16, and end at 6:00 p.m. If you arrive after 6:00 p.m., please go to Firestone Fieldhouse where your housing materials will be available following the evening lecture.

Dorm room reservations must be received by March 1. Rooms will be preassigned and no changes will be made. Be sure to indicate special housing requests, such as rooming close to a friend or with a particular church group, on your Housing Form. A confirmation postcard will be mailed to you upon receipt of your reservation form and dorm fee. We must advise you that, should you decide to cancel your reservation, dorm fees are nonrefundable. For those Lectureship guests who are staying in the dorms, check-out time will be no later than 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 20. Please return your key to the dorm lobby. There is a \$10.00 charge for all unreturned keys. Linens must be collected and placed in your dorm lobby.

#### RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKING

Recreational vehicles can park in one of several places, including the parking lot of the Phillips Theme Tower and the Upper Parking Lot, which is located off Seaver Drive just before President's Drive. There are no hookups available. Please remember to get your temporary parking pass at the guard gate.

Cafeteria: The Pepperdine cafeteria will be open during the lectureship. In order to keep the lines moving, please purchase your meal tickets in advance at Lectureship Central or before and after the lectures in Firestone Fieldhouse. The cafeteria schedule and prices are listed below:

A seven-meal ticket costs \$16.00 (a savings of \$4.25).

This ticket entitles the purchaser to all seven meals served in the cafeteria during the lectureship, except for the banquet meals. The seven meals include 4 breakfasts (Wednesday-Saturday) and 3 lunches (Wednesday-Friday).

To attend breakfast or lunch programs, simply get your tray, select your food and proceed to the room designated for the particular program you want to attend.

Children 12 years of age and under will be charged half price on both the multi-meal and individual meal tickets.

AWP Cafe: The Associated Women for Pepperdine will also be serving food and drinks in the Exhibit Hall every day. All proceeds will go to scholarships for Christian students. In addition, the AWP will be serving pie and coffee from 8:30-10:30 p.m. in the cafeteria after each evening lecture program.

#### CHILD CARE INFORMATION

1. Children must eat all meals with their parents, except for the Tuesday and Thursday dinners when a picnic of hamburgers and hot dogs is planned for all children for a \$2.00 fee. Parents of infants are to bring necessary bottles and baby food jars so our staff can feed their children.

2. Register your children at the Child Care registration desk at Appleby Center. You must sign your children in and out each time you use our Child Care Program.

3. Play clothes should be worn at all times, since we are planning many outdoor activities.

4. Wholesome snacks will be provided. Please do not send sugar snacks, candy or gum with your children. Be sure to notify the registration person of any food allergies.

5. Label all items to be left in Child Care including toys, blankets, and extra clothes. Take special care in labeling baby items (baby food jars, bottles, etc.)

6. A nap area will be available. You may note on your registration form the preferred nap time.

#### **EXHIBIT HALL**

Many exhibitors from across the country have come to share with you new teaching techniques, mission reports, new Christian materials that are in print, reports on what many congregations are doing and other brotherhood activities. Please make a point to visit this central hub of the Lectureship. Exhibit halls will be located in the Student Center (with Lectureship Central and the AWP Cafe) and in the lobby of Murchison Science Center (MSC).

#### TRANSPORTATION

Due to the mountainous terrain of this campus, we have taken extra care in providing you with transportation around the campus for meals and classes and to Firestone Fieldhouse for the main lectures. Buses and vans will be in service every 10 to 15 minutes before and after classes and the main lectures. They will load and unload at Jerry's Tree, the dormitories, Phillips Theme Tower parking lot, the Upper Parking Lot and Firestone Fieldhouse. #### PARKING INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

No parking is allowed in the main parking lot Tuesday through Friday, 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. The security personnel will activate the gate to allow entrance for loading and unloading, after which you will be required to remove your vehicle. You may park your care anywhere along Seaver Drive, Grand Boulevard, or in the Firestone Fieldhouse parking lot.

No parking is allowed in the fire lanes next to the dormitories (this is an official regulation). Reasonable stops for loading and unloading, however, are allowed.


