

Seikilos Epitaph Oldest and first surviving notated Composition (200 BC – 100 AD)




Monophony in Modal Music Gregorian Chant

Liturgical Plainchant (plainsong) for Roman Catholic Church






Guido da Arezzo Today's Notation (1000 AD) Do Re Mi Fa Sol La Ti






