#### Pepperdine Announces program for 70th Annual Bible Lectures

"Can I Get a Witness: Faithfully Following the Lamb in Revelation" is the theme for the 70th Pepperdine Bible Lectures, to be held on the university's campus April 30-May 3, 2013. It's the first time in the lectureship history that Revelation has been the focus of study.

Mike Cope, the new Director of Ministry Outreach for Pepperdine, will be following Jerry Rushford, who after 30 years of directing the lectures has transitioned into the role of director of the Churches of Christ Heritage Center. When Cope announced the theme on the closing night of the 2012 lectures, he quipped, "If I'm going to

jump in it might as well be with both feet"—going on to announce that the biblical text chosen for his first conference would be Revelation.

"Many of us have shied away from tackling Revelation—perhaps intimidated by the strange language of apocalyptic literature and by the bizarre interpretations of the book that float around popular culture," Cope said. "But I'm convinced Revelation has an important message for the

people of God—a voice that is more about hope than despair, more about transformation and faithful living than war."

# President Benton's Announcement About the Future of Church Relations and Bible Lectures at Pepperdine



Malibu, California, October 11, 2011

Pepperdine University religion professor Jerry Rushford is concluding 30 years of distinctive service as director of Church Relations and director of Pepperdine's acclaimed Bible Lectures effective May 4, 2012. Following a year of teaching in Pepperdine's international program in London, England, he will return to Pepperdine to be director of the Churches of Christ Heritage Center.

The announcement was made by Pepperdine University President Andrew K. Benton who has named Mike Cope, a widely respected national figure in the Churches of Christ, to direct Pepperdine's Bible Lectures program following Rushford's transition at the conclusion of the 2012 lectures effective May 5, 2012.

Benton added that Rick Gibson, associate vice president for Public Affairs and chief marketing officer, has been appointed to the position of vice president for Public Affairs and Church Relations effective November 1, 2011. Gibson will continue in his role as the University's chief marketing officer.

"We've known the day would come when Dr. Rushford would conclude his leadership of Bible Lectures," says President Benton. "Jerry deserves our deepest gratitude and respect for his three decades of exemplary service. His enthusiasm, dedication, and passion for excellence set high standards, which called upon all of us to be our better selves. We look forward to his continuing at Pepperdine as director of our Churches of Christ Heritage Center."

In naming Cope director of Pepperdine's Bible Lectures, Benton said the momentum of the lectures will continue to be enhanced and strengthened. "With Mike's years of ministry leadership, national acclaim as a creator of group worship experiences, and his love for the historical Churches of Christ, he will ensure that Pepperdine's Bible Lectures will continue to be successful and of significant value to members of the Churches of Christ both here and abroad."



Cope is a minister, author, lecturer, and prolific writer whose blog has been visited by four million people in the past six years. He was a minister for 27 years, including 18 at the Highland Church of Christ in Abilene, Texas, and eight years at the College Church of Christ in Searcy, Arkansas. He teaches a freshman course at Abilene Christian University each semester, and has delivered the keynote address at Pepperdine's Bible Lectures more often than any other speaker over the past 30 years.

The former editor of two magazines–21st Century Christian for six

years and *Wineskins* for 12 years—he is the author of five books, including 2011's *Megan's Secrets: What My Mentally Disabled Daughter Taught Me About Life* and *One Holy Hunger: When God is All You Want.* Megan's Secrets followed the 1994 death of the Copes' 10-year old daughter, Megan.

Mike and his wife Diane live in Abilene, Texas. They have been married 33 years and have two children: Matt, a physician, and Chris, a freshman Biblical Text major at Abilene Christian University. Matt and his wife Jenna have two daughters, Reese and Ellie.

Benton underscored that Pepperdine's Office of Church Relations and the annual Bible Lectures will continue to build on the solid foundation created and sustained by Rushford. "In

> naming Rick Gibson vice president for Public Affairs and Church Relations, we are placing a strategic initiative at Pepperdine in very capable hands," continues Benton. "We consider the University's Christian heritage and ties to the Churches of Christ as a cornerstone of our mission." Benton added that Gibson.

a former minister in the Churches of Christ, has served on the Bible Lectures team and in senior management positions at Pepperdine for a decade, earning the respect of both his colleagues within Pepperdine and members of the Churches of Christ.

Commenting on the new appointments, Rushford notes, "President Benton is to be commended for encouraging these two multi-gifted church leaders to provide leadership and direction in Church Relations and Bible Lectures at Pepperdine. I know the president is elated that they have agreed to serve, and I share his joy."







# Rushford Leaves a Bible Lecture Legacy

On any given Sunday, Jerry Rushford is standing behind a different pulpit. Or maybe he's planning the next Pepperdine Bible Lectures. Or maybe he's writing a new book on church history or conducting research on hymns.

His zeal, energy and personal warmth to spread unity within the church is boundless. He loves to bring Christian people together to study, fellowship, and worship. And, yes, to better understand each other.

For the past 30 years, Rushford has planned the Pepperdine Bible Lectures held in Malibu, Calif., each May. This year is his last year to act as director. But he has been more than a planner. He is a bridge and a facilitator.

Rushford always has included a wide range of presenters and topics in the lectures. His goal has been to bring Christians together from all over the country and globe, and to promote a positive spirit of unity for the kingdom. These lectures create a four-day haven for unity for 5,000 people from more than 45 states and 35 countries. More than that, the lectures bring together the diverse elements within the church and help us appreciate one another.

Ted Parks, a correspondent for the *Christian Chronicle* and former professor at Pepperdine, said, "Jerry's work has combined the best qualities of our tradition — the use of our minds to grasp God's will and the tight-knit fellowship that gives us community wherever we go."


This year's Bible Lectures feature 288 classes and 360 presenters. Seventy couples also are on the agenda. The 69th annual lectures also feature 13 a cappella singing groups.

Rushford takes seriously the biblical teaching to honor one another. Each

year he recognizes and honors at least a dozen people from many walks of life for their outstanding Christian service.

Rushford began his relationship with Pepperdine in 1978 when he became pulpit minister for the University Church of Christ in Malibu and a professor in the religion division. In his early years of ministry, the majority of his energy was focused on West Coast churches. More recently, Rushford has fanned his influence nationwide.

From November to May, Rushford traverses the country Sunday after Sunday, preaching, plugging the Pep-



perdine Bible Lectures, and promoting connection among diverse segments of the brotherhood. One Sunday he is in Pennsylvania, the next in Indianapolis, and the following in Vancouver, Wash., or Phoenix. He tirelessly spreads the word, and he absorbs the local church history from each city to use as material for one of his books.

On his journeys across the nation, he helps geographically and theologically diverse church leaders stay connected. Rushford's passion has brought Christians together to reflect on their faith and worship, especially concerning fellowship among the diverse elements of the church.

Scott Laird, a minister in Great Falls, Mont., observed, "Jerry Rushford has the unique ability to make the lives of those who have walked by faith in the not so distant past come to life. ... I am thankful for his love of the brotherhood and the actions he has consistently taken to pursue unity."

Rushford reaches Christians all across the country, but he always finds a way to return to the beaches of Malibu. Pepperdine, its students and its faculty hold a special place in his heart. He currently serves as a professor of religion, director of Church Relations, and director of the Churches of Christ Heritage Center at Pepperdine.

Next school year, Rushford and wife, Lori, will serve as house parents for Pepperdine's study abroad program in London, where he will continue research on hymns, for which he is also well known. Rushford can tell you the origins of and little-known facts about many hymns we sing today without batting an eye. He strives to have rich and inspiring worship sessions with vibrant music all within the a cappella practice of Churches of Christ, and these are experienced each evening at the Bible Lectures.

Upon his return to the States, Jerry will devote his time back at Pepperdine to the development of the Jerry Rushford Center, recently announced by President Andrew Benton.

The Center will include the Churches of Christ Heritage Center begun by Rushford in 2009 as a further result of his many travels and collection of local church history.

He loves people and their stories and he loves to share them with others.

"Jerry is a remarkable force for good among Churches of Christ," Benton said.



# 33rd Annual William M. Green Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecture Program October 1, 2012

"Praying the King's Prayer"

(Remembering the Prayers of Three Old Testament Kings)

of teaching and preaching the book and on the way it can help prepare churches for a rapidly changing world. The two resource scholars will be Greg Stevenson, a New Testament professor at Rochester College in Rochester, Michigan, whose book *A Slaughtered Lamb: Revelation and the Apocalyptic Response to Evil and Suffering* will be released at the lectures, and James Walters, a New Testament professor at Boston University.

Theme speakers for the conference, following an opening session on Tuesday afternoon led by Rick Warren, Saddleback Church, Lake Forest, California, will be: Rich Little, University Church of Christ, Malibu, California; Fate Hagood, Metropolitan Church of Christ, Los Angeles, California; Dave Clayton, Ethos Church, Nashville, Tennessee; Don McLaughlin, North Atlanta Church of Christ, Atlanta, Georgia; Randy Harris, Abilene Christian University, Abilene, Texas; Mike Cope, Pepperdine University, Malibu, California; and Rick Atchley, The Hills Church of Christ, Richland Hills, Texas.

Other teachers on next year's program include Chelan Metcalf, Beaverton, Oregon; Steven Moore, Abilene, Texas; and Kindy DeLong, Newbury Park, California.

Cope noted that a new feature of the conference will be extended tracks offered as an option each afternoon. # Pepperdine Establishes the Jerry Rushford Center

Pepperdine University, in the model of the Cushwa Center for the Study of American Catholicism at the University of Notre Dame, announces the establishment of the Jerry Rushford Center for Research on Churches of Christ and the Stone-Campbell Restoration Movement.

The Rushford Center is an umbrella title for several scholarly programs, services, and resources, including:

The Churches of Christ Heritage Center. This center was established by Jerry Rushford in 2009 and is housed in the Payson Library on the Seaver College campus in Malibu. It collects and catalogues various periodicals, publications, papers, photographs, and memorabilia regarding Churches of Christ, especially congregational histories, photos, and records from churches

in Western America and Canada, and throughout the Pacific Rim.

The Restoration History Archives, a collection of books, records, and documents available for those doing research on the history of the Stone-Campbell Restoration Movement.

William M. Green Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecture Program, which annually brings to the Pepperdine University campus a scholar from Churches of Christ as a resource for students, faculty, ministers, and the general public.


Frank Pack Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecture Program, which annually invites to the Pepperdine community a scholar from the broader evangelical world as a resource to faculty, students, ministers, and the general public.

Symposium for Church Historians in the Stone-Campbell Movement, which will annually call together

scholars specializing in church history to deliver, listen to, and comment on scholarly papers intended to advance the knowledge and understanding of the Christian heritage, and the heritage of the Stone-Campbell Movement.


Annotated Bibliography of the Stone-Campbell Movement, which is maintained and made available to all those interested in studying the American Restoration Movement.
