

General Information

Lectureship Central is located in the Exhibit Hall in the Student Center (fountain level). Please register here. The Campus Extension is 270 and the outside number is 213/456-4270. Hours will be 1:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Tuesday and 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., Wednesday, Thursday, Friday.

Housing: Registration will begin at the Housing Reception Center (located next to dormitories) no earlier than 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday. Bring Your Own Bedding—only extralong single beds are provided. No Linens Are Available To Rent except for those who are flying who have made advance arrangements by telephone. The cost will be \$10.00 per set.

Check-out time will be no later than 9:00 a.m. on Saturday. Return your key to Lectureship Central or the lobby of Dorm 11. There is a \$10.00 charge for all unreturned keys.

Meals will be served in the Cafeteria. Costs: Breakfast—\$2.25 Wednesday, Thursday, Friday; Lunch—\$3.00 W,T,F; Dinner—\$3.50 W,F. There will be no variations of menus for special meetings. Meal Tickets may be purchased in advance at Lectureship Central or before and after lecture times at Firestone Fieldhouse. They may also be purchased at the door.

Exceptions: There will be a banquet meal served for the AWP Dinner on Tuesday at 4:30 p.m. for \$4.75 (see reservation form) and for the Men's Fellowship Dinner at 4:45 p.m. for \$4.75 (tickets must be purchased in advance at Lectureship Central).

AWP Cafe: The Associated Women for Pepperdine will be serving food and drinks in the Exhibit Hall each day. Dinner will not be available for the men or children in the cafeteria during the **AWP Dinner** or for the women or children in the cafeteria during the **Men's Fellowship Dinner**; however, it will be available at the AWP Cafe. All proceeds are for scholarships for Christian students.

Exhibit Hall: Be sure to visit this very important center of activity to obtain new teaching ideas and materials and to learn about missions and other efforts of the brotherhood.

Transportation will be provided from the main campus to Firestone Fieldhouse beginning 15 minutes before and 15 minutes after the lectures. Loading and unloading will be from Jerry's Tree, the dormitories, Upper Parking Lot and Firestone Fieldhouse. For special transportation needs, call Lectureship Central (Ext. 270).

Parking Information And Regulations: No parking is allowed in the main parking lot Tuesday through Friday, 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. The security personnel will activate the gate to allow entrance for loading and unloading

after which time you will be required to remove your vehicle; you may park anywhere along Seaver Drive, Grand Boulevard or Firestone Fieldhouse.

*No parking is allowed in fire lane by dormitories—only a reasonable time for loading and unloading (this regulation is made and imposed by the Fire Marshall). *Recreational Vehicles are to park in the **Upper** Parking Lot. There are no hookups available.

Childcare will be provided in Dorm 11 each morning and afternoon, and Dorm 11 and Rooms 122, 123, 124 of Firestone Fieldhouse during the evening lectures. There will be a nominal fee of \$1.00 per child each morning and afternoon, with no charge for the evening care. There will be no charge for Tuesday's childcare; however, you will need to provide a sack dinner for your child at this time.


