A Prayer for the Spirit In the Church

The prayer was written as an opening or closing prayer in a worship service, and could be recited by an individual or corporately by having the congregation reciting together the lines in bold.

We read the words of Jesus in the Gospel of
John
That the Spirit will come upon all his follow-
ers to guide them
May it be so with us

We read in Acts that the first church was
filled with the Spirit
May it be so with us.

We read in Paul's letter to the Corinthians
That the body of believers is the Temple of
the Holy Spirit
May it be so with us

We read that the gospel came to the
Thessalonians
Not only in word, but in the power of the
Holy Spirit
May it be so with us.

We read in 2 Peter that men and women of
the church
Are moved to speak God's message by the
Spirit
May it be so with us.

Oh, God of our ancestors, God of mercy
Hear us this day
As we offer our voices, our hands, our feet
To your glory and your purposes

O God, father of the Son, giver of the Spirit
Hear us this day
