- Barnett, P. The Second Epistle to the Corinthians. NICNT. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1997.
- *Barrett, C. K. A Commentary on the Second Epistle to the Corinthians. HNTC. New York: Harper & Row, 1973. Excellent exposition using historical critical analysis.
- Bassler, J. M. "2 Corinthians." In *The Women's Bible Commentary*, edited by C. A. Newsom and S. H. Ringe, 330-32. Nashville: Abingdon, 1992.
- Belleville, L. L. 2 Corinthians. IVP NT Commentary Series 8. Downers Grove: InterVarsity Press, 1996. Exposition based on NIV aimed at pastors and teachers, combines exeges with contemporary stories and illustrations thought to make the text relevant.
- *Best, E. Second Corinthians. IBC. Louisville: J. Knox Press, 1987. Nontechnical, thoughtful exposition for preachers and teachers.
- Betz, H. D. 2 Corinthians 8 and 9: A Commentary on Two Administrative Letters of the Apostle Paul. Hermeneia. Philadelphia: Fortress, 1985. Comprehensive, technical treatment.
- Bultmann, R. *The Second Letter to the Corinthians*. Trans. R. A. Harrisville from the 1976 German edition. Minneapolis: Augsburg, 1985. Based on Bultmann's lectures on 2 Corinthians ca. 1940-1951. Theological exposition informed by extensive use of comparative material from Jewish and pagan sources.
- Fallon, F. T. 2 Corinthians. New Testament Message 11. Wilmington: M. Glazier, 1980. Compact expositional summary for the nonspecialist.
- **Furnish, Victor Paul. *II Corinthians*. AB 32A. Garden City: Doubleday, 1984. Masterful, comprehensive treatment of literary, historical, and philological issues, informed by theologically insightful exegesis.
- Héring, Jean. *The Second Epistle of Saint Paul to the Corinthians*. Translated by A. W. Heathcote and P. J. Allcock. London: Epworth, 1967. Brief but good.
- Hughes, P. E. Paul's Second Epistle to the Corinthians: The English Text with Introduction, Exposition and Notes. NICNT. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1962. Nontechnical exposition.
- Kistemaker, Simon J. *Exposition of the Second Epistle to the Corinthians*. New Testament Commentary. Grand Rapids: Baker Books, 1997. Written for pastors and teachers with special attention to practical application.
- *Martin, Ralph P. 2 Corinthians. WBC 40. Waco: Word Books, 1986. Sound exegesis informed by broad learning. Deals with technical questions but usable for those without Greek. Especially useful excursuses on various topics.

- Plummer, Alfred. A Critical and Exegetical Commentary on the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians. ICC. Edinburgh: T. and T. Clark, 1966 (1915). Technical treatment of philological, literary, and historical issues reflecting early 20th-century scholarship.
- Strachan, R. H. *The Second Epistle of Paul to the Corinthians*. MNTC. London: Hodder and Stoughton, 1954 (1935).
- **Thompson, James. The Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians. Austin: R. B. Sweet, 1970.
- Thrall, M. E. A Critical and Exegetical Commentary on the Second Epistle to the Corinthians. Vol. 1: 2 Cor 1.7. ICC. Edinburgh: T. and T. Clark, 1994. Treatment of technical questions taking into account 20th-century scholarship on 1 & 2 Corinthians.
- Watson, N. *The Second Epistle to the Corinthians. Epworth Commentaries*. London: Epworth Press, 1993. Exposition based on REB for general reader; direct readable style especially beneficial for preachers and teachers.

- Bray, Gerald. 1-2 Corinthians. ACCS 7. Downers Grove: InterVarsity Press, 1999. Exposition using selections from ancient Christian writers through the eighth century.
- Bruce, F. F. 1 and 2 Corinthians. NCB. London/Grand Rapids: Marshall, Morgan & Scott/Eerdmans, 1971. Learned, compact, clear exposition.
- Martin, Ralph P. 1-2 Corinthians. Word Biblical Themes. Dallas: Word, 1988. Lucid treatment of major theological themes for pastors, teachers, laypersons.
- Talbert, C. H. Reading Corinthians: A Literary and Theological Commentary on 1 and 2 Corinthians. New York: Crossroad, 1987.
- *Thrall, M. E. *The First and Second Letters of Paul to the Corinthians*. CBC. Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 1965. Exposition based on NEB aimed at general reader.
- Witherington, B. Conflict and Community in Corinth: A Socio-Rhetorical Commentary on 1 and 2 Corinthians. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1994.

- Hay, David M., ed. *Pauline Theology. Volume II: 1 & 2 Corinthians*. Minneapolis: Fortress, 1993. Papers of the Pauline Theology Group of the Society of Biblical Literature from 1989-1991. Important essays exploring how to get at Paul's theology in the letters, also very useful comprehensive bibliographies of both letters.
- Belleville, L. L. Reflections of Glory: Paul's Polemical Use of the Moses Doxa Tradition in 2 Corinthians 3.1 18. Vol. 52, JSNTsup. Sheffield: JSOT Press, 1991.
- Bieringer, R., and J. Lambrecht. *Studies on 2 Corinthians*. BETL 112. Louvain: Leuven University Press/Peeters, 1994. Collection of scholarly essays.
- Crafton, J. A. The Agency of the Apostle: A Dramatistic Analysis of Paul's Responses to Conflict in 2 Corinthians, JSNTSup 51. Sheffield: JSOT Press, 1991. Analysis based on Kenneth Burke's rhetorical theory.

- *Furnish, V. P. "Corinthians, Second Letter to the." In DBI (1999) 1.223-27.
- **Furnish, V. P. *The Theology of the First Letter to the Corinthians*. New Testament Theology. Cambridge/ New York: Cambridge University Press, 1999. Excellent treatment of theological aspects of 1 Corinthians building on Furnish's extensive scholarship on Paul and the Corinthian correspondence.
- Georgi, D. *The Opponents of Paul in Second Corinthians*. Translation of 1964 German edition. Philadelphia: Fortress, 1986. Highly influential study proposing imaginative reconstruction of the opponents' self-understanding and their understanding of traditions about Moses and Jesus. Especially valuable treatment of religious propaganda in Greco-Roman world. The English edition contains 100+ pages epilogue updating the debate.
- Georgi, D. Remembering the Poor: The History of Paul's Collection for Jerusalem. Nashville: Abingdon, 1992. Translation of 1965 German edition, expanded. Pioneering scholarly treatment of the collection.
- Harvey, A. E. *Renewal Through Suffering: A Study of 2 Corinthians*. Studies of the New Testament and Its World. Edinburgh: T and T Clark, 1996.
- Kreitzer, L. 2 Corinthians, New Testament Guides. Sheffield: Sheffield Academic Press, 1996. Useful introduction, especially for beginning students.
- Marshall, P. Enmity in Corinth: Social Conventions in Paul's Relations with the Corinthians. WUNT 2nd series, 23. Tübingen: Mohr (Siebeck), 1987. Revised 1980 Ph.D. dissertation at Macquarie University. Analyzes causes and expressions of enmity against Paul in 1 & 2 Corinthians in light of social conventions of friendship and enmity; also explores rhetorical conventions used by Paul, who was trained in rhetoric.
- Murphy O'Connor, J. St. Paul's Corinth: Texts and Archaeology. Good News Studies 6. Wilmington: M. Glazier, 1983. Useful collection of primary sources that illuminate 1 & 2 Corinthians.
- **Murphy O'Connor, J. *The Theology of the Second Letter to the Corinthians*. New Testament Theology. Cambridge/New York: Cambridge University Press, 1991. Excellent summary of theological aspects informed by exegetical analysis.
- Savage, Timothy B. Power Through Weakness: Paul's Understanding of the Christian Ministry in 2 Corinthians. SNTSMS 86. Cambridge/ New York: Cambridge University Press, 1996.
- Schmithals, W. *Gnosticism in Corinth: An Investigation of the Letters to the Corinthians*. Translated by John E. Steely. Nashville: Abingdon, 1971. Interprets the viewpoint Paul opposes in 1 & 2 Corinthians as a genuine Christian gnosticism that originated in Palestine.
- Sumney, J. L. *Identifying Paul's Opponents: The Question of Method in 2 Corinthians*, JSNTSup 40. Sheffield: JSOT Press, 1990.
- Theissen, G. *The Social Setting of Pauline Christianity: Essays on Corinth.* Edited and translated by John H. Schütz. Philadelphia: Fortress, 1982. Pioneering essays employing sociological analysis.
- *Young, F. M., and David Ford. *Meaning and Truth in 2 Corinthians*. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1988. Highly suggestive collaborative effort between a systematic theologian and biblical exegete.
